EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

The City of Monterey Park's recent accomplishments and short-term goals are summarized in the background section as a reference. Staff recommends that City Council receive and file the staff report as a review of completed recent accomplishments and forecast upcoming goals on the horizon.

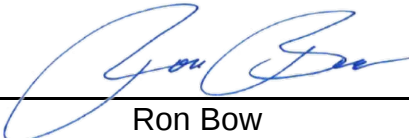

RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that the City Council consider:

1. Adopting a Resolution authorizing the City Manager, or designee, to apply for, submit applications, receive and appropriate grant funds from CalRecycle's SB 1383 Local Assistance Grant Program on behalf of the City; and
2. Taking such additional, related, action that may be desirable.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

CalRecycle requires all jurisdictions to adopt a resolution that authorizes the City or designee to submit applications and execute documents related to the administration of CalRecycle grants. The City proposes to submit an application for the SB 1383 Local Assistance Grant Program. The City would receive approximately \$80,214 from the state for assistance in the implementation of SB 1383 regulations.

BACKGROUND:

Pursuant to Public Resources Code sections 48000 et seq., the California Department of Resources Recycling and Recovery (CalRecycle) administers various grant programs in furtherance of the State of California's efforts to reduce, recycle and reuse solid waste generated in the state thereby preserving landfill capacity and protecting public health and safety and the environment. Beginning with fiscal year 2021-22, CalRecycle is administering a one-time grant program to aid in the implementation of regulation requirements associated with SB 1383.

The Resolution authorizes the City to submit an application for the CalRecycle SB 1383 Local Assistance Grant Program and designates the City Manager as *Signature Authority* to execute all documents related to the program. Funding would be used to implement SB 1383 requirements, including education and outreach and the expansion of the regional Food Recovery Program.

FISCAL IMPACT:

The estimated SB 1833 grant funding allocation for the City of Monterey Park is \$80,214. It is recommended that, if awarded, the City Council accept grant funds and authorize the City's Management Services Department to appropriate \$80,214 in the City budget for assistance in the implementation of SB 1383 regulations.

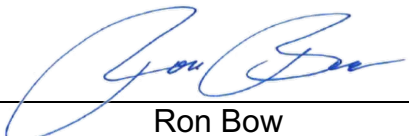

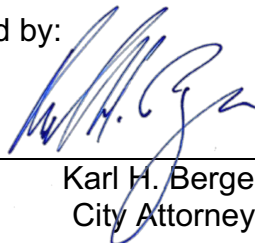

Resolution

RESOLUTION NO.

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING SUBMITTAL OF APPLICATIONS FOR ALL CALRECYCLE GRANTS FOR WHICH THE CITY OF MONTEREY PARK IS ELIGIBLE.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Monterey Park as follows:

SECTION 1: The City Council finds as follows:

- A. Public Resources Code §§ 48000, *et seq.* authorize the California Department of Resources Recycling and Recovery (CalRecycle) to administer various grant programs (grants) in furtherance of the State of California's (state) efforts to reduce, recycle and reuse solid waste generated in the state thereby preserving landfill capacity and protecting public health and safety and the environment; and
- B. CalRecycle is required to establish necessary procedures governing the administration of the application, awarding, and management of the grant programs; and
- C. The SB1383 Local Assistance Grant Program allows for individual grant projects; and
- D. CalRecycle grant application procedures require, among other things, an applicant's governing body to declare by resolution certain authorizations related to the administration of CalRecycle grants.

SECTION 2: The City Manager, or designee, is authorized to submit applications to CalRecycle for all grants for which the City of Monterey Park is eligible.

SECTION 3: The City Manager, or designee, is to execute all grant-related documents including, without limitation, applications, payment requests, agreements, and amendments necessary to secure grant funds and to implement the approved grant project.

SECTION 4: The City Manager, or designee, is authorized to accept and spend the grant monies identified in this Resolution for the purposes set forth herein.

SECTION 5: The City Council hereby amends or supplements the City's Budget for fiscal year 2021-2022 to appropriate the monies identified herein to pay for the retention plan proposed by the City in support of its grant application. The City Manager, or designee, is authorized to implement the purpose of this section.

SECTION 6: *Severability.* If any part of this Resolution or its application is deemed invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, the City Council intends that such invalidity will not

affect the effectiveness of the remaining provision or application and, to this end, the provisions of this Resolution are severable.

SECTION 7: *Electronic Signatures.* This Resolution may be executed with electronic signatures in accordance with Government Code §16.5. Such electronic signatures will be treated in all respects as having the same effect as an original signature.

SECTION 8: *Recordation.* The Mayor, or presiding officer, is authorized to sign this Resolution signifying its adoption by the City Council of the City of Monterey Park and the City Clerk, or his duly appointed deputy, may attest thereto.

SECTION 9: *Effective Date.* This Resolution will become effective immediately upon adoption and will remain effective unless repealed or superseded.

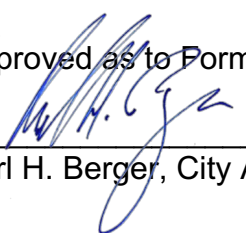

SUBJECT: Purchase of Utility Truck for Water Division

RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that the City Council consider:

1. Waiving bidding requirements pursuant to Monterey Park Municipal Code § 3.20.050 (4) and authorizing the purchase of a Ford F-650 Utility Truck through a Sourcewell Contract with National Auto Fleet Group;
2. Appropriating \$173,500 in Water Operations Funds for the vehicle purchase; and
3. Taking such additional, related, action that may be desirable.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

The Water Division is proposing to replace a utility vehicle that has exceeded its useful service life with a Ford F-650 Utility Truck. Staff is recommending purchase of the replacement truck through a cooperative purchase agreement with National Auto Fleet Group. An appropriation of \$173,500 is requested for this purchase.

BACKGROUND:

The Water Division is proposing to replace a 2006 utility truck that has over 90K miles and has recurring transmission and overheating problems. The vehicle was towed on multiple occasions causing undue delays to critical activities in the field such as water main leak repairs.

The proposed replacement vehicle is a 2022 Ford F-650 utility truck that will be equipped with accessories that are necessary for day-to-day operations of the Water division. The options include reinforced lifting capacity for cranes, watt power inverter to operate power tools, power take off system for jack hammering (which eliminates the need for use of a compressor), ergonomically designed storage for all tools and equipment for safety and efficiency.

Staff researched alternative fuel options including diesel and compressed natural gas (CNG) engines. Locally, CNG fueled utility vehicles are only being offered as an aftermarket addition at an additional cost between \$30K to \$40K. Diesel fueled vehicles are subject to additional California fleet requirements including mandatory diesel emission

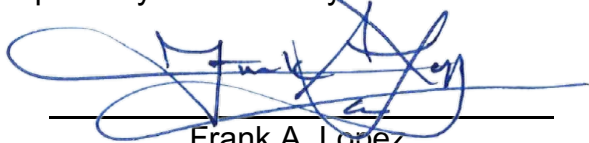
control (DEC) strategies. DEC Strategies require a fuel regeneration process that renders the vehicle inoperable for a period of time, which may interrupt the City's day-to-day operations, limiting staff's ability to complete critical activities. Diesel-powered heavy-duty vehicles are also subject to South Coast Air Quality Management District's (SCAQMD) Rule 1196 and require special approval prior to purchase. Staff is committed to research and recommend alternative fuel vehicles when feasible. However, in this specific circumstance and due to the limitations of diesel vehicles, increased costs for a CNG fueled vehicle, and the City's poor experience with aftermarket retrofitted vehicles, staff is recommending purchasing the Ford F-650 Utility Truck with a conventional gasoline fuel system. The vehicle would comply with SCAQMD Rule 1196, which aims at reducing air toxic and criteria pollutant emissions. Additionally, since California's current vehicle emission standards for new vehicles are higher than in previous decades, the proposed new F650 utility truck will operate much cleaner than the City's current 2006 gas-fueled utility truck.

The City of Monterey Park is member of Sourcewell, a government agency that combines the purchasing power of multiple agencies into a cooperative purchasing group in order to solicit lower prices than what a smaller agency may obtain through an individual bid. Sourcewell contracts are competitively solicited and meet the public bidding process. Sourcewell is offering the purchase of the 2022 F-650 vehicle through a contract with National Auto Fleet Group (Contract 060920-NAF). The cost to purchase and outfit this vehicle is \$173,460.09.

FISCAL IMPACT:

An appropriation of \$173,500 for the cost of the replacement vehicle is requested from the water operations fund 401.

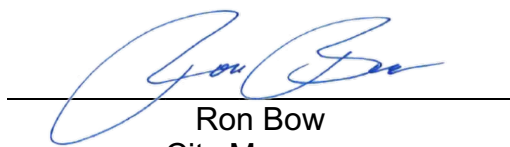

SUBJECT: Purchase of Hydro Jet Sewer Excavator Truck (Vactor)

RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that the City Council consider:

1. Waiving bidding requirements pursuant to Monterey Park Municipal Code § 3.20.050 (4) and authorizing the purchase of a 2022 CNG Vactor Truck through a Sourcewell Contract with Haaker Equipment Company;
2. Appropriating \$552,466 for the purchase of the vehicle from the City's Sewer Collection Fund; and
3. Taking such additional, related, action that may be desirable.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

The South Coast Air Quality Management District (SCAQMD) is requiring the City to replace a heavy-duty service vehicle from the City's fleet per SCAQMD Rule 1196, Clean On-Road Heavy-Duty Public Fleet Vehicles. The vehicle to be replaced is unit # 113, a diesel powered Vactor hydro jet-rodder. This vehicle is used daily to clean City sewer lines from the street via manholes.

Staff recommends the replacement vehicle be purchased through a Sourcewell cooperative purchase agreement with Haaker Equipment Company. An appropriation of \$552,466 from the Sewer Fund is requested for this purchase.

BACKGROUND:

The City of Monterey Park was notified by the South Coast Air Quality Management District (SCQAMD) in May of 2021 that vehicle unit #113 was deemed out of compliance per SCAQMD Rule 1196. This is primarily due to the vehicle having a diesel fuel injection system. AQMD Rule 1196 which applies to public agency fleets with 15 or more heavy-duty vehicles that exceed 14,000lbs in GVW requires agencies to acquire alternative-fuel, dual-fuel, or dedicated gasoline heavy-duty vehicles.

The proposed replacement vehicle is a new 2022 Freightliner Vactor 2110 Sewer Cleaner. The proposed replacement vehicle uses Compressed Natural Gas (CNG) instead of diesel fuel which is a climate friendly alternative that reduces greenhouse

gas (GHG) emissions by up to 20 percent compared to diesel engines. The SCAQMD, which typically allows 12-18 months for such a replacement, has given the City until December 31, 2022 to take unit #113 out of service. The estimated time for the replacement unit to be placed in service is approximately 180-300 days from the date of notification to the dealer.

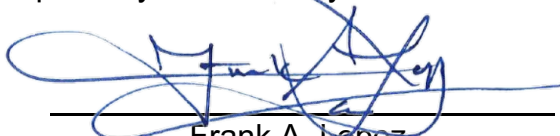
The City of Monterey Park is member of Sourcewell, a self sustained government agency that combines the purchasing power of multiple public sector agencies into a cooperative purchasing group to obtain lower prices. The resulting pricing is much lower than what a smaller agency would obtain through an individual bid. Sourcewell contracts are competitively bid. Haaker Equipment Company in LA Verne, CA. proposed the 2022 Vactor via *Sourcewell Cooperative Purchasing Agreement ~ Contract # 122017-FSC* for a total cost of \$552,465.23.

FISCAL IMPACT:

An appropriation of \$552,466 from Sewer Collection Fund 411 is requested to complete this purchase.

The current vehicle, MPK Unit #113, is a viable vehicle for agencies or organizations not subject to SCAQMD Rule 1196. Staff is actively exploring the sale or trade-in of the unit to assist in offsetting the cost of this replacement. It is anticipated that the potential revenue associated with the sale or trade-in of the vehicle will be between \$105,000 and \$200,000. Staff will update City Council when the amount is determined.

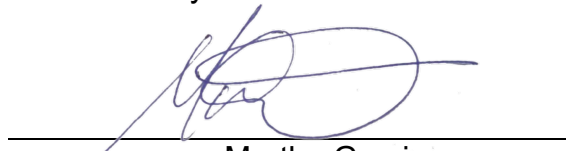

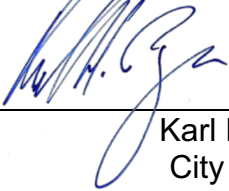

RESOLUTION NO.

**A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MONTEREY
PARK AFFIRMING SUPPORT OF REPRODUCTIVE FREEDOM**

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Monterey Park as follows:

SECTION 1: The City Council finds as follows:

- A. The Supreme Court of the United States acknowledged in its 1973 landmark decision Roe v. Wade that the ability to make a private medical decision impacting one's reproductive health is a constitutionally protected right.
- B. Before 1973, the year when Roe v. Wade was enacted, women faced significant obstacles to safe reproductive health services, resulting in widespread loss of life and severe illness.
- C. In 2002, California enacted the Reproductive Privacy Act, which makes the fundamental right to choose to bear a child or choose and obtain an abortion the official public policy of the State of California.
- D. The restrictions and bans that violate reproductive freedom disproportionately impact populations that already face barriers to accessing care, including the most marginalized women: low-income women, women of color, immigrant women, and young women.
- E. Access to abortion continues to be a right in name only, with many unable to access the medical procedure due to restrictive laws, financial hardships, and other barriers.
- F. As States around the country enact harsh laws that violate the fundamental rights of people, the City of Monterey Park will continue to uphold everyone's equality and liberty by protecting their reproductive freedom, educating residents about their rights to reproductive freedom, to fully exercise their reproductive rights and acting as a model for other cities that want to uphold complete reproductive freedom for all.
- G. Those seeking abortion and other reproductive care in Monterey Park have the fundamental right of privacy for personal reproductive decisions. The right to privacy includes a women's right to choose.
- H. The City Council affirms its commitment to the reproductive freedom rights afforded to all women as essential to the lives, liberties, health, and equality of women regardless of socioeconomic, ethnic, racial, cultural or religious background, age or sexual orientation, and to opposing any laws or regulations

that pose a threat to reproductive freedom, reproductive rights, sexual freedom, and self-determination.

SECTION 2: *Electronic Signatures*. This Resolution may be executed with electronic signatures in accordance with Government Code §16.5. Such electronic signatures will be treated in all respects as having the same effect as an original signature.

SECTION 3: *Recordation*. The Mayor, or presiding officer, is authorized to sign this Resolution signifying its adoption by the City Council of the City of Monterey Park and the City Clerk, or her duly appointed deputy, may attest thereto.

SECTION 4: *Effective Date*. This Resolution will become effective immediately upon adoption and will remain effective unless repealed or superseded.
