Langley Center Code of Conduct

The Langley Center is committed to providing a safe, welcoming, and respectful environment for all participants, visitors, and staff. To ensure a positive experience for everyone, all patrons are expected to follow this Code of Conduct:

1. **Respect Others**
 - Treat fellow participants, staff, and volunteers with courtesy and respect at all times.
 - Use kind and appropriate language. **Foul or offensive language is not permitted.**
2. **Maintain Physical Boundaries**
 - Refrain from any **unwanted physical contact** with others.
 - Keep hands, feet, and personal belongings to yourself.
3. **Resolve Conflicts Peacefully**
 - **Arguing, yelling, or disruptive behavior** will not be tolerated.
 - If you have a disagreement, seek staff assistance rather than engaging in conflict.
4. **Follow Facility Rules**
 - Use equipment and facilities properly and safely.
 - Follow posted guidelines for activities and classes.
 - Clean up after yourself in all areas, including activity rooms and dining areas.
5. **No Harassment or Discrimination**
 - Harassment or discrimination of any kind, including based on race, gender, religion, age, or disability, will not be tolerated.
6. **Maintain a Safe Environment**
 - Report any unsafe conditions or incidents to staff immediately.
7. **Personal Items**
 - The center is not responsible for lost or stolen items. Please keep personal belongings with you at all times.
8. **Compliance with Staff Directions**
 - All participants are expected to follow the directions and requests of staff promptly and respectfully.

Consequences for Violations:

Failure to follow the Code of Conduct may result in:

- Verbal warning
- Suspension of center privileges
- Permanent removal from the facility in severe or repeated cases
