Corn tortillas, tamales, two kinds of refried beans, chile colorado, chile verde. The best tasting tortillas, fresh and hot, white corn only. If you wanted, you could buy the ingredients to make burritos at home, pints and quarts of beans and meat, rice and the big monster tortillas. You could even buy grated cheese by the pound. Mexicatessen was named after the many delicatessen businesses that were around that time.
