Work Completed:

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7.B Traffic Safety Grants –

- Active Transportation Plan (ATP) – Application opened in March 2026 for eligible activities such as bike and pedestrian environmental, design, right-of-way and construction, develop plans, and non-infrastructure projects.
- Highway Safety Improvement Program (HSIP) – Application is expected to open in May 2026 to all public roads, pathways, or trails for preliminary engineering, right-of-way, and construction.
- Safe Streets and Roads for all (SS4A) – Application is expected to open in spring/summer 2026 for agencies with jurisdiction over public roads. Multitude of infrastructure and non-infrastructure activities such as action plans, supplemental planning, demonstration, and implementation.

7.C W. Garvey Avenue and W. Floral Drive –

- Submitted grant funding of \$5M to Metro for Floral Drive from Atlantic Blvd. to Mednick and Monterey Pass Road, Garvey Ave from Atlantic to Casuda Canyon adding a sidewalk for safety issue

7.D. Hellman and New Ave signal improvements -

- Analyzing to make a left turn signal due to heavy traffic affected by the schools with requests received to improve the area.


